Position Description

This position is responsible for assisting the equipment operator of a digger truck.

Essential Functions

Knowledge/Education/Skills/Experience

- Minimum 2 years experience within the general/site-work construction industry is required
- Must possess a valid State of Maine drivers license, with the ability and motivation to obtain a Class B rating within 6 months of employment
